

CQC regulation is in flux

Pillars of an ICS

The Purchaser / Provider "marketplace" is no longer the primary driver

- 1.Prevent physical and mental ill health and help people to make better lifestyle choices
- 2. Make sure services are tailored and targeted to people
- 3. Make it easy for people to get the right care, when they need it in the right place for them
- 4. Health and social care need to work seamlessly
- 5. Make organisations as efficient as possible



Best value care, with least variance






