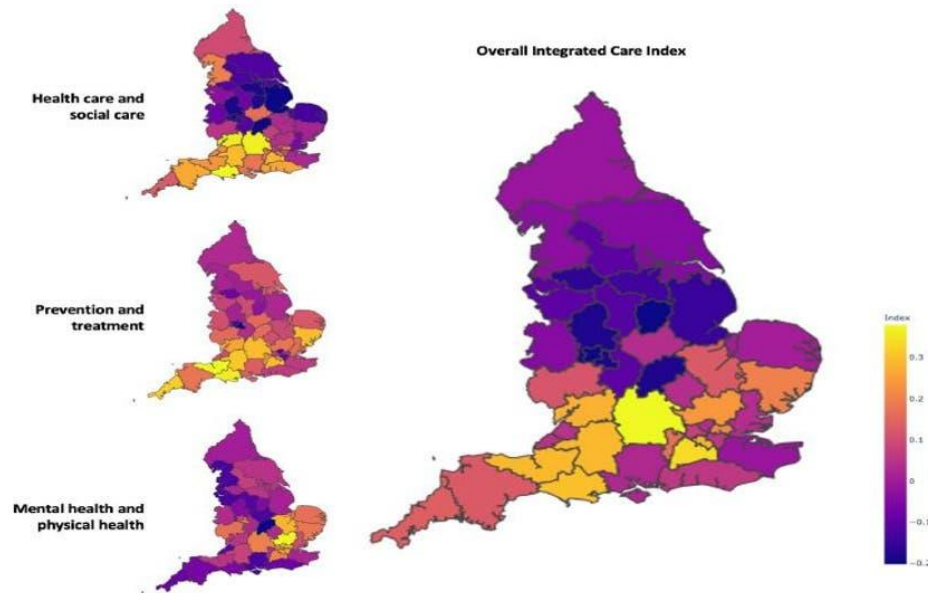
ICS (42) become legal entities

Pillars of an ICS

The Purchaser / Provider “marketplace” is no longer the primary driver

1. Prevent physical and mental ill health and help people to make better lifestyle choices
2. Make sure services are tailored and targeted to people
3. Make it easy for people to get the right care, when they need it in the right place for them
4. Health and social care need to work seamlessly
5. Make organisations as efficient as possible

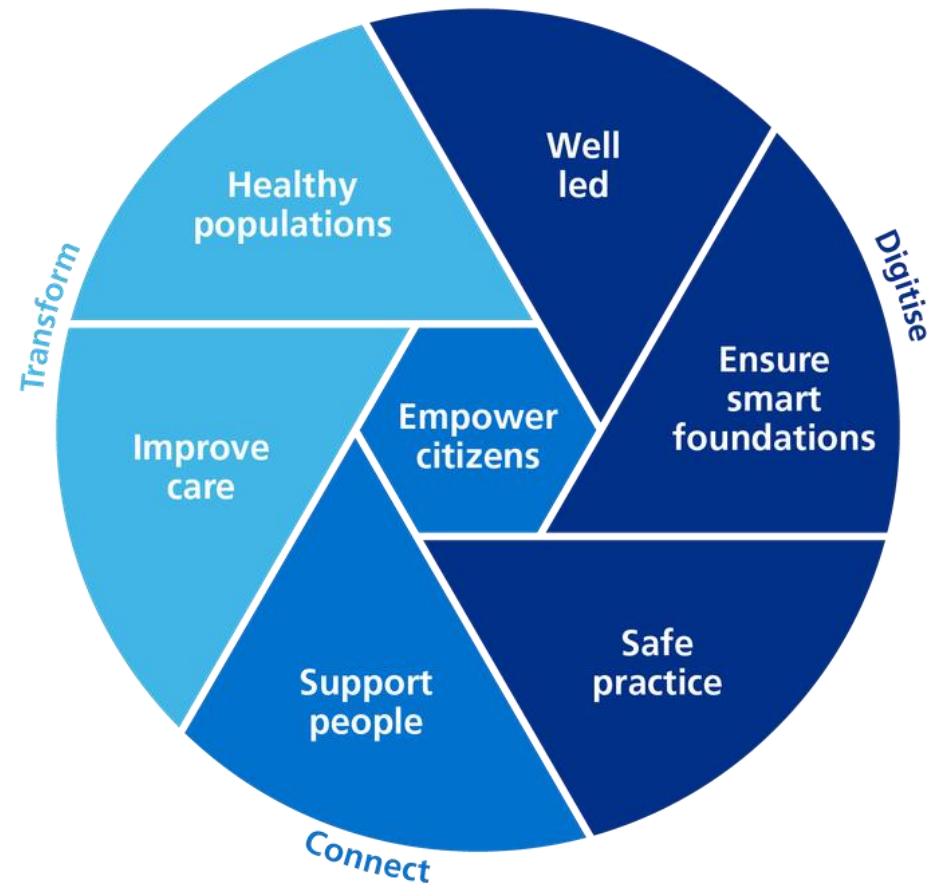

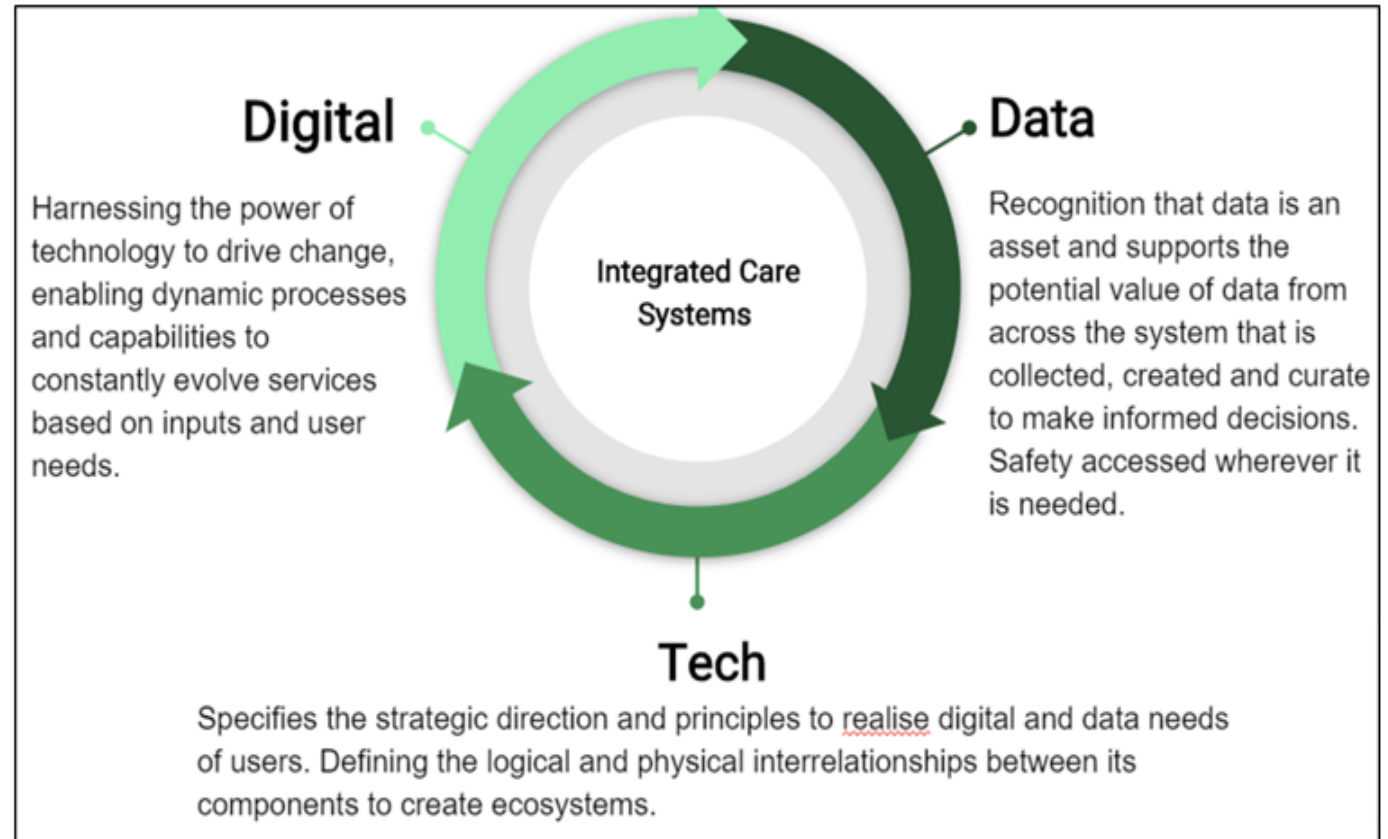

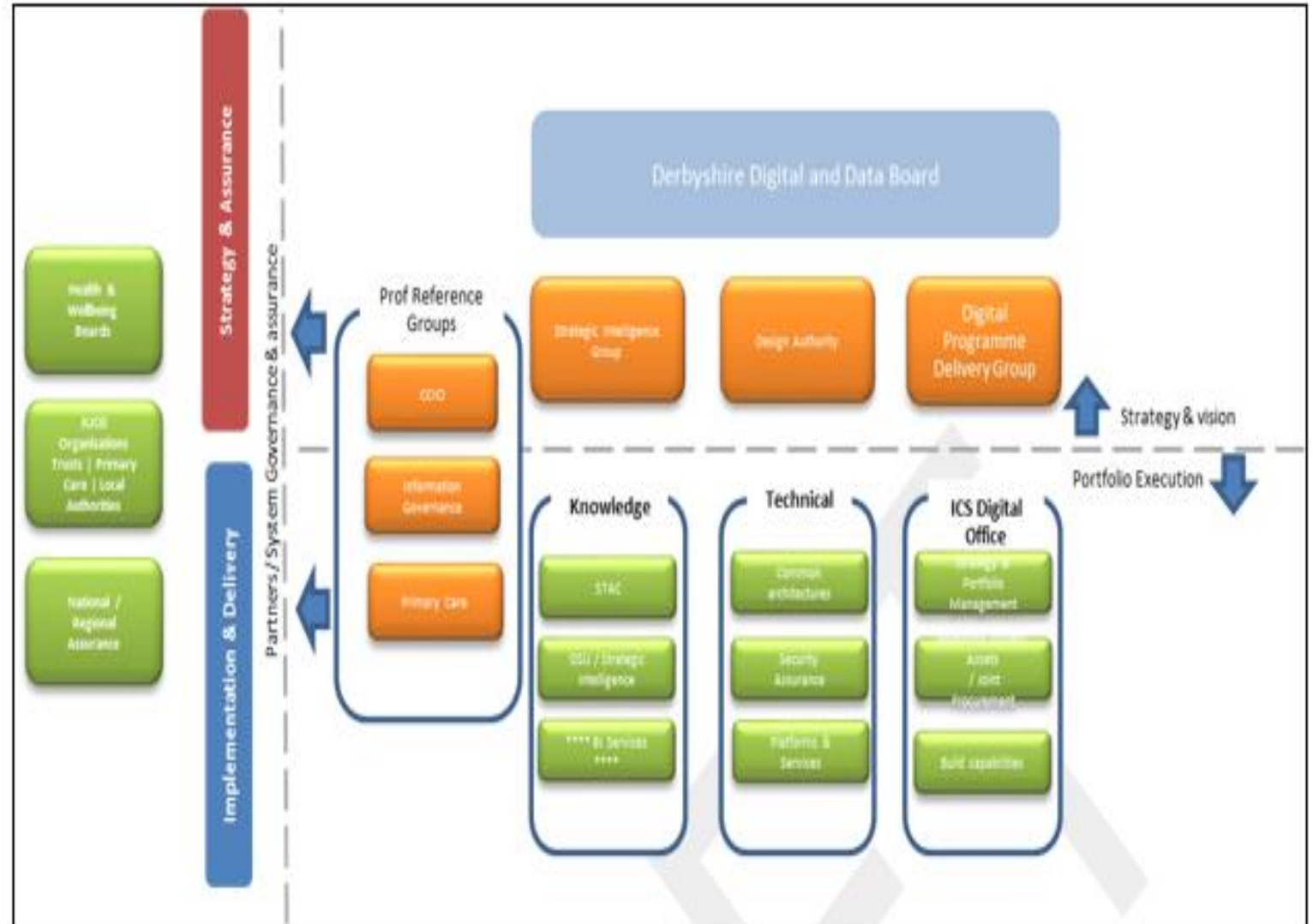
