# **Minutes**

#### 1. Welcome & Apologies

Craig Carroll welcomed members to the meeting and thanked everyone for joining.

#### 2. Minutes of RTC Meeting 10<sup>th</sup> November 2023

#### 3. NBTC & RTC Chair's Meeting, 18th March 2024

Craig Carroll attended both these meetings virtually.

CC feedback on the points RTC Members asked to be raised at these meetings:

Change in title of "HTCs" to "PBM Committee" - needs recognition as covers so much more than "Transfusion". Unfortunately, this was not something the NBTC would consider.

Issues of Refusal for Consent and Education in the NW being delivered by colleagues from the Jehovah's Witness Group. NBTC felt this wasn't an issue and needed to be dealt with locally. However, CC has maintained this needs to happen nationally so still exploring routes by which this can be looked at.

#### Key highlights from NBTC and RTC Chairs Meetings:

- Transfusion 2024 launch of Transfusion Training Hub to support the professional development of scientific and clinical colleagues. Provides direct links to many resources all in one place.
- National Haemoglobinopathy Register now live.
- Infected Blood Inquiry (IBI) to be reported on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2024.

RTC Chairs now paid for some of their time so Trusts should be freeing up time for the chair's. As a region need to look at how better we can work as an RTC, addressing things like how Anaemia / Cell Salvage and how these areas are being dealt with. Suggested setting up regional working groups, having representatives from each Trust.

#### 4. NHSBT Customer Services & PBM Updates

#### **Customer Services**

Presentation given by Rukhsana Hashmat. Updates on:

- Irradiation Indicator labels
   Currently use 2 types Gemma & X-ray. Colindale and Manchester
   Hospital Services will soon change to irradiating blood components by X-ray from May 2024.
- National Haemoglobinopathy Register (NHR)
   HNR now available. Please can all centres looking after patients with
   haemoglobinopathies ensure their laboratory data on red cell antibodies is
   entered on the NHR to ensure the NHR holds a relatively complete data set
   of antibodies for a patient. If you do not have access to the NHR, please
   contact your haemoglobinopathy lead and they can ensure access is
   provided.
- NHS England funded programme for blood group genotyping Improving blood matching for people living with anaemias, sickle cell disorder, & thalassemia. Blood group genotyping began January 2024, for all people in England.
   Forms & resources: <a href="NHS England programme for Haemoglobinopathy blood group genotyping - International Blood Group Reference Laboratory - NHS Blood and Transplant (nhsbt.nhs.uk)</a>
- Removal of maximum age requirements for red cell transfusion
   This change will improve the ability to provide patients with red cells that
   better match their extended phenotype, especially for patients when they
   are not phenotype. Red cells up to standard shelf life are considered
   appropriate for transfusion to all patient groups, excluding neonates and
   infants receiving large volume transfusions.
- R2R Blood

Three days advance notice of this component R2R2 requirement allows us to move this unit between our hospital services departments. Currently, 50% of all R2R2 requests are received with less than one day notice. Would like all arthritic patients to have the phenotype they need. Need your help in identifying what barriers there is to ordering in advance.

#### PBM

Presentation given by Jo Bark. Highlights:

- Transfusion Training Hub
   New resource launched a couple of weeks ago. Developed as part of
   Transfusion 2024 strategy and is a one stop shop of transfusion resources
   all in one web page which supports professional development. It is free and
   accessible on the NBTC website.
- Blood Essentials
   Digital knowledgebase replacing A Drop/Wealth of Knowledge expected to be launched by the end of April 2024.
- 2023 NCA Audit of Audit QS138
   Published on 29<sup>th</sup> February 2024. Two recommendations from the audit.
  - Hospitals to continue to look at barriers to any implementation, to comply with the NICE quality statement.

- Hospitals to undertake regular audit using the QS Quality Insights Audit Tool. Encourage any hospitals not signed up, to do so and those hospitals who have signed up, please continue to use the tool to input audit data. The more data that is in the tool, the better the comparative data will be.

#### 5. Feedback from Hospitals

Thank you to Amanda Gould who presented the feedback from the 15 HTC reports received. Transfusion Practitioners mostly completed the reports.

#### Highlights

HTC Achievements - themes

- Electronic tracking systems funding and implementation
- Link staff training.
- Improved competency and training, traceability compliance achieved 100%.
- Major Haemorrhage process reviewed.
- Merging Trusts standardising paperwork and processes
- New staff

#### HTC Key Priorities - themes

- Review of TACO (following Patient Safety Alert)
- · Reviewing HTC and improving engagement
- Updating policies and documents
- EPR Electronic requesting and prescribing
- Rollout of electronic tracking systems

HTC Audits in Progress / Completed - themes.

- National audits completed or ongoing.
- Bedside audits including staff performing transfusion (agency)
- Authorisation / paperwork audits / consents
- Staff capacity mentioned as limitation to audits.

#### Concerns / Constraints

SaBTO Guidance on Consent; would it be more practical to have a National Transfusion Consent process. When new processes are released, guidance is given so there is a national approach to change.

In addition to the standard questions asked, the following is feedback from the additional information requested from Hospitals:

#### LIMS

- Trusts looking to upgrade: 7.
- Advantages of new system:
  - Harmonization and standardization between different trusts
- Disadvantages of new system:
  - Staff engagement and time to validate and implement a whole new system.

- Process changes (one Trust mentioned, they'd lost automated serological cross matching, which meant that more patients were barred from electronic issue, therefore, increased lab workload)
- ABO Cryo couldn't be issued to unknown patients.
- Change and authorisation of results.

#### Regional Access to Apheresis

- Some hospitals do have an SLA.
- Most Trusts said clinicians would access this direct with NHSBT.

#### **Clinical Transfusion Training**

- Mainly Transfusion Specialist provide the training.
- Lots of variation in how the training is delivered and the time frames required.
- Trusts who already us NHSBT e-learning would be interested in a generic / transferable transfusion training mandatory training module.

#### Aim of project

- In addition to the core 11 from the CSTF we are proposing having a set of agreed additional mandatory training for trainees which stays.
   with them and is transferable when they rotate between Trusts.
- Prevents Trainees having to unnecessarily repeat mandatory training, improves productivity by removing unwarranted variation.
- Improves compliance rates for trainees and therefore patient safety.
